There were 42 incidents reported in the Lyndhurst area during January and 27 reported in Ashurst.

Assaults

All seven assaults were in the Lyndhurst area. There were six assaults on police officers and one which was domestic related.

Burglaries

There were two burglaries at dwellings above pubs in Lyndhurst and one in Ashurst, where an undisclosed amount of cash and a trinket box was stolen.

Non dwelling burglaries

Three youths have been arrested on suspicion of forcing entry and causing damage at a local Lyndhurst school. A shed in Alpine Road, Ashurst was broken into and a Black and Decker strimmer was removed.

Criminal damage

A window was smashed at a premises on Lyndhurst High Street on the morning of January 12. Police are keen to speak to a group of youths who were seen in the locality shortly before the incident occurred. If anyone has any information about this incident please contact us on **101**.

Two damage incidents occurred at Lyndhurst police station and one was a domestic related incident in the Ashurst area.

Theft

Coin bags were removed from an office in a pub in Lyndhurst. A man has been arrested in connection with this and enquiries are ongoing. Oil was stolen from an oil tanker at Bank, Lyndhurst.

Lead was stolen from a school roof in the Ashurst area and scrap metal was stolen from a rear garden on the Lyndhurst Road, Ashurst.

Theft from motor vehicles

There were two incidents in the Ashurst area where vehicle registration plates were stolen from vehicles.

A car parked in Woodlands Road, Ashurst was broken into and a laptop rucksack was removed.

We have had a slight increase in reports of cold calling, especially at the weekends. Could we ask people to be vigilant and also to look out for their elderly and vulnerable neighbours. Please report any suspicious behaviour to police.
