There were 66 incidents during July in Lyndhurst and 45 in Ashurst. There has been a slight increase in the number of recorded incidents compared to June. However, many of July's incidents were of a non-crime type, such as missing persons.

Burglary

A house in the Meadows in Lyndhurst was entered and property was stolen. A caravan at a farm on Ringwood Road was entered and an iphone and some cash were stolen.

Burglary – non dwelling

A sub station and outbuilding were broken into in Woodlands and tools were stolen.

Theft from motor vehicles

Two cars parked in Emery Down on different afternoons had their number plates stolen. Two cars parked at the Andrew Mares car park had their rear windscreens smashed and a hand bag was stolen from each. Please remember to remove valuables from your vehicle before leaving it unattended.

Theft of vehicles

A car was found in Bartley Road, Woodlands

which is suspected to have been stolen.

Criminal damage

A woman was arrested for causing criminal damage on two occasions. The other damage incidents were committed at Lyndhurst police station and a local school.

Theft

A local woman was arrested for stealing alcohol from a store in Lyndhurst. Four wooden patio chairs were stolen from the rear garden of a house in Hazel Grove in Ashurst.

Rowdy Behaviour

A woman was arrested for being drunk and disorderly at a hotel in Ashurst. A man was arrested following a public order incident in Fletchwood Lane in Ashurst.

We have been increasing our patrols of local parks and open spaces in response to concerns about individuals who have been drinking alcohol and causing damage and leaving broken bottles behind. The recreation ground in Wellands Road in Lyndhurst was left in a mess over the weekend of July 23 - 24 and damage was caused to the skate board ramp. We believe that a group of people had been camping there. If you witness any rowdy or anti-social behaviour in the area then please report it to police immediately so that we can attend and deal with it.
