Assaults (5)

A man in Lyndhurst was arrested and charged for assaulting a taxi driver.

Two men were involved in an altercation in Wellands Road in Lyndhurst.

A woman was assaulted during a domestic argument in Lyndhurst. She did not require any medical treatment.

Criminal Damage (1)

A man was seen late at night spraying graffiti on a wall in Gosport Lane Lyndhurst.

Theft (6)

A man stole two Turkeys from a store in Lyndhurst in the lead up to Christmas.

An electricity meter was stolen from the front of a house in Lyndhurst.

A store in Ashurst had a bottle of Champagne stolen.

Three men were arrested following an incident at the same store in Ashurst on suspicion of going equipped to steal.

Thefts from motor vehicles(6)

There has been an increase in thefts in Forest car parks. Items have been stolen from secure cars. Hand bags being the most common item stolen. Always secure your vehicle when it is left unattended and remove all property from inside. Do not attempt to stow away property in the boot once you have parked, thieves may be watching.
