Theft from motor vehicles

A car parked in Lyndhurst town centre car park was broken into and a Sat Nav device was stolen. Please remember to remove all valuables from your vehicle.

Criminal damage

A man was detained after a bench and door handle were damaged at a home in Copse Woodlands. A fence that was erected to keep dogs off the football pitch at Colemead Rec, Lyndhurst was pulled down, causing damage.

Theft

A lady had her handbag stolen when she left it laying next to her car in Millyford Bridge car park. As mentioned earlier, 130 memorial plaques were stolen overnight between the September 19 and 22 from the cemetery at Bolton Bench, Lyndhurst. A large amount of cash was stolen from a safe in a shop in the High Street, Lyndhurst.

There were 88 incidents reported during September. We are pleased to report that there have been no significant increases in crime this month. However, offenders did steal 130 memorial plaques from the cemetery at Bolton Bench, Lyndhurst. This has caused a great deal of distress to the family and friends of the deceased and PC White would like to hear from anyone who has any information that could help us to find those responsible.

Burglary

There were no dwelling burglaries reported during September. This is positive news but please remain vigilant at all times and ensure you take appropriate security measures to protect your property.

Burglary – non dwelling

A convenience store in Ashurst was targeted in two separate incidents. On September 14 five men forced the front door to steal cigarettes and on September 30 four men forced their way into a store shed using garden tools and stole soft drinks. They made off in a maroon people carrier. If you saw anything suspicious on either of those evenings please get in touch with us. A garage was entered in Netley Marsh and two cycles were stolen. One of these has now been recovered.
