BEAT REPORT FOR LYNDHURST AND ASHURST OCTOBER 2011

There were **80** recorded incidents

Dwelling Burglary – 1- Offenders attempted to break into a house in Woodlands Road, Woodlands .They damaged the patio doors and smashed a window but no entry was gained.

Non Dwelling Burglary– 1- Guests visiting a hotel in Lyndhurst had clothing and cash stolen from the wardrobe in their room.

Assaults – 2- The only two assaults in October were of a domestic nature and against a police officer.

Criminal Damage – 5 – A female motorist broke down in Ashurst Bridge Road .On returning to her car in the morning she discovered extensive damage and it had also been covered in spray paint graffiti.

Theft – 9- A young man stole two cases of beer from a store in Ashurst.

Two customers in Lyndhurst had mobile phones stolen; one was from a public house the other was from a restaurant.

A hospital in Lyndhurst had copper lined roofing felt stolen.

A store in Lyndhurst had a large quantity of chocolate stolen by a smartly dressed couple.

A care worker stole cash from one of her patients at a home in Lyndhurst .The offender was arrested and has appeared in court.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 2- Offenders broke into a car parked in Millyford Bridge car park .They smashed a window and stole a handbag.

In Andrew Mares car park a car was entered and cash was stolen form a handbag hidden under a seat.

Please DO NOT leave valuables in your vehicle. If it's not left in the vehicle it can't be stolen!

Rowdy Behaviour -8- Youths were seen to remove newly laid turf at Whartons Lane Park in Ashurst .As they ran off they dropped the turf on the play equipment.

At Boltons Bench car park in Lyndhurst a group of men in cars were causing a disturbance .They were also shining laser lights.

Lyndhurst didn't have any issues with Halloween but Ashurst had a group up to 50-70 youths wandering around the side streets .They threw a pumpkin at a car in Foxhills causing damage. A female motorist driving along Lyndhurst Road had a firework thrown at her car.

Metal thefts remain a problem. A Cottage in Emery Down had copper cable stolen.

There has been a group of men selling cleaning products door to door in the Woodlands and Bartley area. They are staying in Bournemouth and get dropped off in the surrounding area's .They are from the Nottingham area. They should have a Pedlars Certificate issued by the police. Please contact the police if they are seen in your neighbourhood.

Both Ashurst and Lyndhurst have rowdy behaviour listed as their community priority. These are to remain following consultation.
