Our current local policing priorities are:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

There were 75 incidents reported in Lyndhurst and Ashurst during August.

### Assault

The only assaults reported last month were either offences against police officers or assaults during domestic incidents.

### Burglary

There was only one house broken into, and this was in the Foxhills area of Ashurst.

The offenders forced open a door and searched the house, taking a large quantity of jewellery.

### Burglary non dwelling

Both incidents happened in Lyndhurst Road, Ashurst, though they are not necessarily linked. A garage and a shed were broken into, where two cycles and a drill were stolen.

### Theft from motor vehicle

Cars parked in Andrew Mares, Acres Down and Knights Wood Oak were all broken into by smashing windows. Hand bags were stolen from each of the cars. Please remember to take your belongings with you when you leave your car.

### Criminal damage

In Pikes Hill, Lyndhurst, a car was kicked causing a large dent.

### Theft

There has been a spate of lead thefts from roofs of properties in the area. A nursing home in Ashurst had lead stolen and on a second occasion an attempt was made to steal more at the same address. In the High Street in Lyndhurst, lead was stolen from the roof of a café and also from a flat in the same street. A drunken man was found to be in possession of a stolen bottle of whisky in Ashurst. He was arrested and charged.
