Total incidents reported: Ashurst & Netley Marsh - 22 of which 9 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 47 of which 15 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – A & NM (2) There was a complaint of a male acting inconsiderately and one of nuisance phone calls. Lyndhurst (5) There were two noise complaints, one report of inconsiderate behaviour and two vehicle complaints.

Assaults - A & NM (0) One was domestic related. Lyndhurst (3) One occurred at a local school, one involved neighbours and another was domestic related.

Burglary - A & NM (1) A house was broken into in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (0) Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.

Burglary (non dwelling) - A & NM (2) Two outbuildings were broken into and items taken. Lyndhurst (3) There were three reports at commercial premise. Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.

Criminal Damage – A & NM (1) A fence was damaged. Lyndhurst (2) Two vehicles were damaged.

Drugs - A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (2) Following arrest two people were found in possession of illicit drugs.

Public Order – A & NM (1) There was a report of a drunk male at a public house. Lyndhurst (0)

Road traffic collisions – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (4) Two persons suffered injuries.

Road traffic incidents – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (2) Two drivers were summonsed for speeding offences.

Theft – A & NM (1) There was an isolated incident at a convenience store. Lyndhurst (1) Bricks were stolen from a charity premise in Emery Down.

Theft from vehicles – A & NM (2) Two vehicles were siphoned in Ashurst Bridge. Lyndhurst (2) Two vehicles were broken in to in a Forest car park. Please ensure you continue to secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.

Other incidents – Between 1st November 2013 and 30th June 2014 1718 drivers have been dealt with for speeding offence on the beat. You can access up to date data. Speed watch – A total of 1449 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in August. Of those, 437 (30.2%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
