Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and Anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: Ashurst & Netley Marsh – 24 of which 10 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 34 of which 9 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – A & NM (2) There were reports of a suspicious vehicle and a drunk male. Lyndhurst (2) There was a noise complaint on the High Street and a resident received nuisance communications.

Assaults – A & NM (2) Both were domestic related. Lyndhurst (2) There was an incident that was domestic related and an incident at a local care home.

Burglary – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (0) *Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – A & NM (1) An unoccupied house was broken into in Ashurst and an outbuilding was broken into in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (1) A shed was broken into in Emery Down. *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – A & NM (5) In Woodlands four people reported damage to perimeter fencing and a car window was also damaged. Lyndhurst (1) Property was damaged following an incident in Emery Down.

Public Order – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (1) There was a dispute over an animal.

Road traffic collisions – A & NM (1) A pony was hit in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (5) One involved a horse, and one resulted in two fatalities.

Road traffic incidents – A & NM (2) A driver was summonsed for a speeding offence and another for driving without insurance. Lyndhurst (2) Drivers were summonsed for speeding offences.

Theft – A & NM (1) A bike was stolen from outside a pub. Lyndhurst (2) There was a shoplifting and items were stolen from a garden.

Theft from vehicles – A & NM (0). Lyndhurst (2) Both occurred in Forest car parks. *Please ensure you continue to secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Speed watch – A total of **1008** vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in December. Of those, **469 (46.5%)** motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit in Lyndhurst. Please contact us if you would like further details of the recorded data and the action taken by police. Thank you to all involved in helping to make our villages safer.
