Total incidents reported: Ashurst & Netley Marsh - 29 of which 13 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 32 of which 10 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – A & NM (1) There were reports of a suspicious vehicle. Lyndhurst (2) There was a noise complaint and a resident received nuisance communications.

Assaults – A & NM (2) Both were domestic related. Lyndhurst (2) There were two domestic related incidents.

Burglary – A & NM (1) Items were taken from a premise in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (0) Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.

Burglary (non dwelling) - A & NM (7) Outbuildings and sheds were broken into in Ashurst and Netley Marsh. Lyndhurst (1) Items were stolen from a shop. Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.

Criminal Damage – A & NM (1) There was an incident at a care home. Lyndhurst (1) Property was damage following an incident in Lyndhurst.

Public Order – A & NM (1) There was an incident in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (0)

Road traffic collisions – A & NM (2) Two minor collisions occurred in Ashurst. Lyndhurst (6) Two resulted in minor injuries and two involved animals.

Road traffic incidents - A & NM (3) Two drivers were summonsed for a speeding offences and another for driving without insurance. Lyndhurst (1) A drivers was summonsed for a speeding offence.

Theft – A & NM (1) Logs were stolen from outside an address. Lyndhurst (2) There were two thefts at local businesses.

Theft from vehicles – A & NM (0). Lyndhurst (2) One occurred in a Forest car park and the other in a residential street. Please ensure you continue to secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.
